<u>Course Description</u>: American Literature is a comprehensive survey of American authors from the Pre-Colonial Era to the present. The course is designed to familiarize students with traditional and lesser-known authors while continuing to develop the critical reading, thinking, and writing skills introduced in previous English classes and in alignment with Georgia Standards of Excellence (ELA GSE).

- Age of Reason/New Nation (including selections from: Franklin, Jefferson, Payne, Henry)

- Transcendentalism (including selections from: Emerson, Thoreau)
- Realism/Regionalism (including selections from: Douglass, Twain, London)
- Beginnings of the Modern Age (including *The Great Gatsby* and *Of Mice and Men*)
- Post Modernism
